RECONSTRUCT CRIME, GIVING FULL PARTICULARS:

On Thu. Dec. 4, 1905 at about 6³⁰ a.m. James Michael Anderson went to the house at 8917 W. Linton Ave. This is the house of his wife, or Alice Marie Anderson. They are separated at the present time and not living together. James went to the rear of the house and picked up a window sash lock. He went to the front of the house, north side of building, and threw the lock through a 31" x 30" window, located in the bedroom. He then crawled into the bedroom. Alice, having the looking glass and seeing him coming into the bedroom, she ran out the rear door. He followed her out the door. She ran west up the alley to No. 88 St. and then north to 3442 W. 88 St., the home of a girl friend, Kathleen Carwith. He followed her to that address. She banged on the front door and began to scream. He pulled out a gun and she crouched down on the porch. He fired one shot, from the gun he had in his hand, striking her in the throat. He then went back to 8917 W. Linton Ave. and called the police.

ALICE ANDERSON WAS CONVEYED TO COUNTY GENERAL HOSPITAL BY SP 744 GTE WHERE SHE WAS PRONOUNCED DEAD.

A 38 CALIBER REVOLVER, CHARTER ARMS BRAND, WAS TAKEN FROM THE SUBJECT AT 8717 W. LISBON AV. BY P.T.M. CIRILLO. IT WAS IN HIS RIGHT COAT POCKET.

Subject interviewed at the Det. Bureau on 12/4/75 at 8:55 am. Advised of his constitutional rights which he states he understands.

States he was born in Racine, Wis. Attended St. Catherine High School & completed 12th grade. In Military Service Married Alice Mae (Mae) 6-26-67. They have 3 sons. States that they separated 12-20-74 & that he then moved to Chicago Ill to live with his mother.

Re: this offense he admits shooting his wife Alice. That he came here from Chicago with the gun via Greyhound Bus.

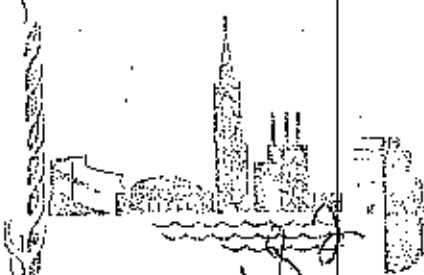

- A. 38 caliber revolver, Charter Arms, blue steel, 5-shot, 2" barrel, #4 (Milw PD Inv. #493040, Item #1)
- B. 38 caliber casing, spent, marked S & W, SPL & P" (Milw PD Inv. 493040, Item #4)
- C. Three-38 caliber cartridges, live, hollow points, marked S & W (Milw PD Inv. #493040, Item #6)
- D. Copper colored metal fragment, star shaped (Milw PD Inv. #493049, Item #1)
- E. Womens purple, long sleeve knit sweater, torn at the neck, with blood & burn stains (Milw PD Inv #496195, Item #2)

Examination Requested:

Request an examination be made on revolver (Item A) to determine the foot pounds of trigger pull, and its ability to fire cartridges similar to Item C.

Request an examination be made of spent casing (Item B) for possible comparison to metal fragment (Item D).

Request an examination be made of metal fragment (Item D) to determine caliber, weight, and any other important information tests can reveal for identification as possibly being the fatal bullet.

Request an examination be made of sweater (Item E) in the area of front neck band, at blood & burn stain area, to determine if gunpowder residue is present and if metal fragment (Item D) passed through this garment. Information needed as to whether or not Item D passed through Item E at front neck area or at back neck area. If any gunpowder residue is found, request an examination be made to determine distance of gun muzzle from victim.

Request any further examinations you deem necessary that might assist us in this investigation.

Statement of Facts:

Victim was chased from her home by husband after threats to kill her and both ran to 3462 N 88 Street. While victim was crouched on front porch stoop, husband fired on shot from 38 caliber revolver, which we believe was held at her throat area within a distance of two feet. It is unknown at this time if bullet entered the front area of throat (damaged area of sweater).

Revolver (Item A) was located in suspects coat pocket.

Items B & C were in revolver.

Metal fragment (Item D) was recovered at autopsy on 12-4-75 at 315PM, near small hole in victim's back, between skin and sweater.

Sweater (Item E) was recovered from medical examiner's office.

Burleigh (442-6740). I obtained the following statement from Mrs. Ashworth: "I could hear the faint noise in the background, it became louder. I thought that it was my son. It got louder. I then looked out the window, and I saw Alice run by. I yelled to my husband and told him to help her. I then saw Jim run by. I pounded on the window in an attempt to alert Jim to my presence. We, my husband and I, ran to the front door. We opened the inner door, and I observed Alice bent over on the front step. She was screaming. Jim was standing just to the right of her. I saw a gun in his right hand. We then slammed the door, and a few seconds later heard one shot."

Mrs. Ashworth went on to say that she has known Alice for 5 years. She further stated that Alice and her husband Jim, were in the process of a divorce, and Alice had been having problems with her husband, and he has threatened to kill her in the past. The last incident she was aware of was approximately 3 months ago, sometime in September, when Alice's husband, Jim, allegedly pointed a gun at Alice and threatened to kill her. Mrs. Ashworth stated she was positive it was Jim who she observed standing on the front step holding the gun, as she has seen him the past. She further stated that he was wearing a dark overcoat, and she described the gun as a small dark pistol, held in the right hand in a downward position. Mrs. Ashworth stated the time was about 6:15AM to 6:20AM, stating she had set her alarm for 6:04AM. When the alarm went off,

she turned the alarm off and continued to lie in bed for a few moments, at which time she heard the screaming.

On Thursday, Dec. 4, 1975, at 8:15AM, while in the Detective Bureau Assembly with Patrolman Edward Blaski, Det. Robert Schultz and I, Det. Leslie Pedersen, we conducted an interview with the suspect in the above offense, namely, James Michael ANDERSON, W/M, 30 years, 2-16-45, of 535 N. Michigan Ave., Apt. 2806, Chicago, Ill., who states that he is an insurance salesman, currently unemployed and separated from his wife, the victim, Alice ANDERSON.

Mr. ANDERSON was advised of his constitutional rights by Det. Robert Schultz, and after stating each element of his rights, Mr. ANDERSON stated that he fully understood each of them, and the interview continued, with Officer Schultz asking, "Do you know what you are here for?" The suspect replied, "Yes, I suppose the shooting." He was then advised to give an account of the circumstances regarding this incident, and he informed us that he was willing to relate the elements of this offense, and the argument preceding it.

The subject related, "I woke my wife up. I broke the bedroom window with a brick from the alley." ANDERSON explained that the window was located at the front part of the house, on W. Lisbon Ave., and that he climbed through the broken window and observed his wife in the room where this window is located, that being her bedroom. He said that he observed her becoming hysterical, and she began to run through the house, towards the back door, and ANDERSON states that he followed her, chasing her through the house. Both exited the rear door, towards the alleyway; ANDERSON admits he chased his wife to the front yard of the ASHWORTH home (located at 3462 N. 88th St.). ANDERSON informed us that while both were standing on the front porch, they were struggling over the gun, and stated, "I don't remember who pulled the trigger, but the gun went off

Explain in detail what work was done on the case:

once." ANDERSON further related that he observed her slump to the porch, on her back, with her eyes rolling back. ANDERSON states that he took his son, Steve, 5 years, and another son, Jimmy, 8 years, who were standing on the lawn of this home, back home because he noticed that she was bleeding and he did not want the boys to see it.

According to ANDERSON, he placed the gun back into his topcoat pocket, went home with the boys, and called the Police.

He began questioning ANDERSON regarding the background of his purchase of the weapon, and he related that he purchased the gun in Chicago, Ill., about 1 month ago, for a security job at the Jewel Food Stores. He then stated, "I bought it to Milwaukee because I was having trouble talking to my wife." He went on, "Sometimes, she is very nice, and sometimes, she can be completely impossible, totally impossible." He went on to state that approximately 3 months ago, he had an argument with his wife at her home, and had carried with him, a .25 cal. automatic pistol, and during the argument, had pointed this weapon at her for approximately 2 seconds. She told him, "You're not yourself," and at that time, he states, he put the gun back in his pocket. After a period of time, ANDERSON relates, they were again on speaking terms, he gave the gun to his wife, and left.

ANDERSON further informed us that he can remember that during the argument, she stated to him, 3 or 4 times, as a dare, (to show she was aggressive), "Shoot me!" ANDERSON explained that he feels that her aggressiveness is due to the fact that she is said to have attended school at Mount Mary College.

The above statement was reviewed in my (Det. Pedersen's) Official Police Department memo book, by myself, read aloud, and Mr. ANDERSON personally handled my memo book, reading each page and each line, and after reading the entire statement, signed his name below the last line, being J. ANDERSON, with a date of "12/4/74 - 9:15AM". This signature was witnessed by me, Det. Leslie Pedersen, with my signature, the date and time, and that of my partner, Det. Robert Schultz, also with the date and time.

Mr. ANDERSON was asked if he would be willing to provide a detailed, handwritten statement, and he told us that he was just "too nervous and upset" after the incident, and was unable to do this. Mr. ANDERSON was advised that several phone calls had been made by his attorney, James Wood, and at that time, he related to us that he did not wish to have Attorney Wood re-

Removed from the body was one pair of blue jeans, one cream colored panties, w/excessive amount of blood on the crotch area, a lavender long sleeve sweater, heavily blood stained, w/3/4" by 3/4" hole in the back, to the right of the middle line of the sweater, 2 1/2" right of the posterior middle line. A 13/4" by 1-3/4" hole in the front area of the sweater. One white bra, heavily blood stained on the strap area. Recovered by Dr. Chester Erwin by the left shoulder between the skin and the clothing, a daisy shaped copper fragment with a round area, 5/6" in the frange area 3/4" overall 7/8", the thickness of 1/16" of an inch. This fragment was recovered at 11:00 a.m. and placed in a box and sealed by Medical Examiner Erwin. This was received by Det. Borhart at 3:15 p.m. on Medical Examiner Report Case #2369 and was re-opened and re-sealed at 3:44 p.m. by Medical Examiner Chester Erwin in the presence of Attorney James Wood. This box contained the copper fragment was placed on Police Inventory #493049. Found by Dr. Erwin was a large hole, 1-1/8 inch by 5/8 inch with burn marks on the front of the throat area of the victim. Also dried blood over the upper exterior body. The hole in the back of the body was 1-5/8" by 1/4 level with the spine fracturing the vertebrae and breaking the first rib. It is the opinion of Medical Examiner Erwin that the bullet entered thru the back of the body and exited thru the throat area. Death was caused by exsanguinuin due to gunshot wound to the neck. The shot was back to the front in a straight line to the body and the subject had bled to death.

Explain in detail what work was done on the case: On Thursday, 12-4-75, at 5:10 p.m. we were sent to Mount Mary College, 2000 N. Menomonee River Pkwy. to interview the following subjects.

We interviewed a Miranda, Margaret, W/T, bn 9-4-23, of 2727 N. 74th St., phone 258-3923. She is the chairman of the Department of Occupational Therapy at Mount Mary College and was the teacher and confidant of the victim Alice Anderson for the past 2 years. Ms. Miranda states that she contacted our department regarding Alice Anderson because she feels that there are certain things which should be brought to light regarding Alice Anderson's state of mind regarding her husband who has been arrested for her homicide.

She stated that Alice had told her on numerous occasions how deathly afraid she was of her ex-husband and in fact feared for her life. She further stated to Ms. Miranda that in the early fall of 1975 possibly in September Alice missed school and called Ms. Miranda to give the following excuse. Ms. Miranda stated Alice told her that she was at home with her three small children and had just feeding them and sent them outside to play. She stated that she suddenly felt that somebody else was in the home and became aware that somebody was standing behind her. She turned around and saw that her husband was in the home and was holding a gun on her. Alice told Ms. Miranda that she and her husband stayed in the kitchen of her home for approximately 2 hours during which time he held the gun on her constantly and several times actually placed the gun against her side. Alice fixed him coffee and talked to him for approximately 2 hours and convinced him to leave the gun and flee the city, possibly crossing the state line and she in turn would give him this time to

cross the state line before she called the Police. Ms. Miranda further stated that Alice told her that once he had left the residence, she waited a period of time, then called the Police and Ms. Mirandas best knowledge is that Alice turned the gun over to the Police who told her that it was fully loaded. Alice further stated to her that her ex-husband apparently found a key she had hidden below a door mat after he had left the residence and she had all the locks changed in the home. She further stated that he apparently had another key made for her door and used him as a means to enter her home. She further stated that he told her that he had hid in her closet for two hours waiting for the proper time to talk to her. She further stated that he had done this on another prior occasion but left when it became apparent that she was either not coming home or that the neighbors saw him enter.

Alice also portrayed to Ms. Miranda that since their divorce her husband was becoming increasingly disturbed and upset to the point where she was extremely afraid of him to the point of panic. Ms. Miranda also stated that Alice was a very stable type person, intelligent and never at any time had any bad reports about her husband other than that she was extremely afraid of him. She further stated that she never spoke badly of her husband, but would constantly sympathize with him and attempted to make a proper home for her children.

We also interviewed a Judy Payne, W/S, bn 3-5-45, of 7008 W. Lloyd St., phone 258-9627, who is an instructor in the Occupational Therapy Dept. She stated that Alice was a student of hers and that Alice had told her on several occasions how frightened she was of her husband. Both Judy Payne and Margaret Miranda further stated that there were several other students who were quite close to Alice and these students possibly would have further information regarding Alice and her ex-husband and also one of the students stayed with Alice Monday and Tuesday of this week and one was to stay with her last night but was stopped by her parents of doing so. We asked for the students name and it was the desire of Miranda that she first talk to these two students and receive their permission to give their names to the P.D. which she stated she felt they most certainly would. She further stated that she would supply the Police Dept. with their name on Friday, 12-5-75, and would contact either the department or myself or Det. Schneider personally.
